## Carleton Place Community Labyrinth

Come and visit our Grass Labyrinth which is cared for by the Labyrinth Committee. All are welcome to walk the outdoor grass labyrinth at any time. The labyrinth is an ancient spiritual tool which has been used for over 4000 years. The labyrinth pattern is similar to a circle, one of nature's most basic forms, a symbol of harmony, grace and transformation. One entrance point guides the walker through a series of switchbacks that leads eventually to the center of the pattern. Walking a labyrinth is reported to support healing, meditation and personal growth.
