Garbage Collection

Recycling (Blue Box)

No sticker is required for the first bag of garbage each week. Additional bags must have sticker each attached. The Town is no longer providing stickers but stickers can be purchased at the same locations as in the past and existing stickers will be honored until 2020.

Recycling is now mandatory as Carleton Place strives to reduce municipal waste being sent to landfills

On the collection day between Christmas and New Years each year residents may put up to three non-stickered bags out for collection

Residents shall now place all #1 through #7 plastics in the blue box for collection

Any large household items (couch, chair, mattress, etc.) must have four stickers attached to them for collection

A new company, Matrec, will be collecting recyclables in Carleton Place for the next seven years

Any box of waste larger than 1m x 1m x 1.5m or weighing more than 15 kg must now have two stickers attached to it for collection

A new company, Matrec will be collecting recyclables in Carleton Place for the next seven years

Appliances must have four stickers attached to them for collection. As well, they must be properly decommissioned and tagged by a certified technician indicating that the refrigerant gas has been properly removed.
