NOTICE OF OPEN HOUSE AND PUBLIC MEETING OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT AND DEVELOPMENT PERMIT AMENDMENT TO INCLUDE SOURCE WATER PROTECTION POLICIES AND SCHEDULE CHANGES

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Committee of Council for Public Meetings (the Planning and Development Committee) will hold a public open house on Tuesday February 16, 2016 AT 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm in the Auditorium, 175 Bridge St to identify the policies and schedule changes that are required as part of the implementation of the Mississippi-Rideau Source Protection Plan (SPP). The SPP came into effect on January 1, 2015 and the Clean Water Act 2006 requires that municipal councils amend their Official Plans and other policy documents to comply.

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Committee of Council for Public Meetings (the Planning and Development Committee) and will hold a public meeting on Tuesday March 1, 2016 at 8:00 pm in the Council Chambers of Town Hall located at 175 Bridge Street. In consideration are the proposed revisions with respect to the Source Water Protection Policies to be included in both the Town of Carleton Place Official Plan (OP 2011) and the Development Permit By-law (15-2015), under Section 26 and Section 70.2 of the **Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990.**

THE SUBJECT LANDS are described as all the lands within the boundaries of the Corporation of the Town of Carleton Place. A key map has not been included since both the Official Plan and Development Permit By-law changes encompass all the land within the Town of Carleton Place.

Any person may attend the public meeting and/or make written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed Development Permit By-law schedule changes and the proposed policy and schedule changes to the Official Plan. If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the Town of Carleton Place before the Development Permit By-law is passed or, the County of Lanark before the Official Plan Amendment is passed the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council to the Ontario Municipal Board.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submission to the Town of Carleton Place for the Development Permit By-law or the County of Lanark for the Official Plan Amendment before the By-laws are passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board, unless, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

Additional information in relation to the proposed amendments are available for inspection between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm Monday – Thursday and 8:30 am to 4:00 pm Friday in the Development Services Department at the Town Hall or by calling (613)257-6251.
