## BACKYARD COMPOST REBATE PROGRAM

In an effort to reduce the amount of waste at the curb each week the Public Works Department will be providing residents of the Town of Carleton Place a \$40 rebate for the purchase of a backyard composter. Residents may purchase a composter of their choice and then complete and submit the rebate application. Receipts must indicate purchase in 2016. ## FREecycle WEEKEND

Residents are encouraged to participate in Carleton Place Freecycle taking place Friday, June 3 through Sunday, June 5. Freecycle is a movement intended to reduce the amount of unwanted items that get sent to the landfill.

To participate, place unwanted re-usable household items at the curb in front of your home on June 3 with a sign or stickers indicating FREE for take-away by neighbours and other residents. Freecycle happens rain or shine - use your discretion when deciding whether to put items at the curb.

Examples of 'freecycling' items include: books, CDs and DVDs; furniture, electronics and small appliances; sports equipment and toys; yard and gardening tools and equipment

(e.g., lawn mowers, snow blowers, rakes, shovels); kitchen gadgets, dishes, cutlery, pots and pans; construction materials (e.g., nails, paint, wood); and clothing.

**Items not picked up by 9 p.m. Sunday evening are the responsibility of the homeowner/residents and must be returned to their homes. Leftover objects will not be collected by the Town.**
