NOTICE OF PASSING OF AN AMENDMENT TO

DEVELOPMENT PERMIT BY-LAW 15-2015 TOWN OF CARLETON PLACE- DPA-02-2016

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Carleton Place passed By-law 38-2016 on the 13th day of September, 2016, under Section 34 and 70.2 of the Planning Act, R.S.O., 1990.

THE SUBJECT LANDS are described as all the lands within the boundaries of the Corporation of the Town of Carleton Place. A key map has not been included since the Development Permit Amendment changes encompass all the land within the Town of Carleton Place.

THE PURPOSE AND EFFECT of the amendment is to add Section 3.46 "Model Home/Dry Home" to the General Provisions of the Development Permit By-law. The added provisions will outline special requirements for the construction of model homes within an approved draft plan of subdivision.

TAKE NOTICE that any person or public body may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the by-law by filing with the Clerk of the Town of Carleton Place not later than the 12th day of October, 2016. An appeal must be accompanied by the fee required by the Ontario Municipal Board.

Community Emergency Response Volunteer (CERV) Program

The Town of Carleton Place is offering a three evening Program that promotes emergency preparedness and the training of volunteers to respond upon request, to municipal emergencies. Training is offered on the subjects of emergency preparedness, first aid and the techniques of assisting the police and local fire company.

Classes will commence on Thursday, October 13, 2016 for three consecutive Thursday evenings at the Carleton Place Town Hall, 175 Bridge Street at 7:00 p.m. The first aid component of the Program will be taken on Saturday, October 15, 2016 and on Sunday, October 16, 2016 by instructors at the Carleton Place and District Swimming Pool, 351 Bridge Street from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Upon completion of the Program, graduates will receive a Certificate of Completion at a presentation ceremony during a meeting of Town Council.

Watershed remains at a Level III/Severe Drought Status

Mississippi Valley Conservation Authority (MVCA) Low Water Response Team (LWRT) is advising residents that despite recent rainfall the entire watershed remains at a Level III / Severe status. Shingles Vaccine Free for Seniors

The shingles vaccine will be available across the province for people 65 to 70 years of age. The government is investing \$68 million over three years in order to publicly fund the vaccine, which will reduce the likelihood of Ontario seniors developing the painful infection, and reduce visits to emergency rooms and hospitals. Those who are eligible for the shingles vaccine should contact their primary care doctor or nurse practitioner to receive the vaccination.
