

John Bell House
15 High Street

This residence was built in the 1830's for John Bell, son of the Reverend William Bell, the first Presbyterian minister of the Perth district in 1817. The Bell family were prominent businesspeople in the early history of Carleton Place.

Constructed of rough-hewn stone it is a fine example of the Georgian style of architecture prominent during the 19th century. The home retains the original roofline, soffit, and fascia. The front door displays a semi-elliptical fanlight and sidelights. Adjacent to the residence are two architecturally significant stone hedges (walls) on the east and south side of the property
