



Policy Statement for Bronze Medallion & Bronze Cross Programs

To maintain quality program standards, the Town of Carleton Place must ensure each candidate understands the process for certification programs.

Bronze Medallion & Bronze Cross (20-22 hrs) teaches an understanding of the Lifesaving principles in the four components of water-rescue education. Judgement – Knowledge – Skill – Fitness.

It is the responsibility of the Candidates & Parents:

- To review the program dates and the exam date (which is the last day of the program).
- 100% attendance is required to complete the Bronze course. Exceptions will be considered ONLY if advance notice is forwarded to the Instructor in writing.
- Participants must not be late for ANY class. It's disruptive and he/she will have missed important information.

Bronze Medallion & Bronze Cross requires a practical EXAM by an examiner. This is scheduled on the last day of the program. Examiners are booked in advance. Alternate exam dates cannot be accommodated. In exceptional circumstances, should an alternate exam date be arranged, the candidate must pay administrative fees to cover the costs.

The length of the exam depends upon class size, pool space, and the abilities of the candidates.

The Bronze Instructor is the ONLY person who has the authority to invite the candidate to the exam. The Instructor will make the decision as to whether the candidate is qualified and has met all the criteria set forth by the Lifesaving Society the week prior to the exam. If the candidate does not meet the 'Must Sees' and does not demonstrate proper maturity throughout the course, he/she will not be invited to attend the exam.

"Unsuccessful Candidates" will be required to redo the entire course.
