MUNICIPAL UPDATES

Reminder – Lawn Watering Restrictions – The Public Works and By-Law Enforcement Departments are requesting residents reduce their outdoor water consumption until further notice. The lack of precipitation has resulted in a substantial increase in demand for water from our water treatment plant. It is vital that residents strictly adhere to the [Lawn Watering By-law](#) and consider voluntarily reducing the frequency of outdoor lawn watering.

From May 1st to September 30th, the following regulations apply:

1. No person using the Town of Carleton Place water supply system shall water from more than one connection.
2. Residents occupying an even-numbered address may water on even-numbered calendar days only.
3. Residents occupying an odd-numbered address may water on odd-numbered calendar days only.
4. Watering is allowed only between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., and between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m.

The By-law Department will be increasing enforcement which could result in a fine of \$55 for those who choose not to adhere to the By-law.

[Service Canada Begins Gradual and Safe Reopening of In-person Locations](#) - As more parts of our economy begin to reopen, the Honourable Ahmed Hussen, Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, announced the gradual and safe reopening of up to 90 Service Canada Centres across the country. Decisions about reopening are being guided by public health advice, and with the priority that as many Canadians as possible should be able to access an open Service Canada office.

[Federal Economic and Fiscal Snapshot](#) - The COVID-19 crisis is the challenge of our generation. The Government of Canada has responded with rapid and broad-based emergency support measures to protect the health and economic well-being of Canadians.
