Dual Stream Recycling Transition Period Ending August 17th - The Town of Carleton Place would like to thank residents who have embraced the dual stream collection system. We truly appreciate your efforts. As a reminder, residents are required to separate their recycling into two (2) separate streams to coincide with alternating collection weeks. Paper products must be separated from containers. Please see the waste calendar that was provided with your yellow bin to determine what materials are being collected each week. Residents can use alternative recycling containers (blue bins and store-bought recycling bins) for separating their materials. **Effective August 17th, your material will be left behind and not collected if it is not properly sorted. You will be required to correctly sort to ensure collection in the future.** If you have misplaced your brochure, a copy is available on the [Town's website](#). If needed, you can receive a paper copy from the Town Hall (175 Bridge Street) or the Information Centre (170 Bridge Street). Together, we as a community can ensure we are providing the purest, uncontaminated material to market. Let's make Carleton Place a community that is moving forward to protect the environment for future generations.

[Government of Canada announces funding for Indigenous communities and organizations to support community-based responses to COVID-19](#)

- The Government of Canada recognizes that First Nation, Inuit and Métis are among the most at risk and face unique challenges in addressing COVID-19. It also recognizes that Indigenous leadership, governments and organizations are best placed to determine the needs of Indigenous Peoples and to develop community-based solutions that respond to these challenges. Today, the Honourable Marc Miller, Minister of Indigenous Services, announced an additional \$305 million to support Indigenous Peoples during the COVID-19 pandemic, through the Indigenous Community Support Fund.

PROVINCIAL UPDATES

[Ontario Providing Municipalities with up to \\$1.6 Billion in First Round of Emergency Funding](#)

- The Ontario government, in partnership with the federal government, is delivering on its commitment to provide up to \$4 billion in urgently needed one-time assistance to Ontario's 444 municipalities. Municipalities will be provided with up to \$1.6 billion as part of the first round of emergency funding under the Safe Restart Agreement. This funding will help municipalities protect the health and well-being of the people of Ontario, while continuing to deliver critical public services, such as public transit and shelters, as the province continues down the path of renewal, growth and economic recovery. The Town of Carleton Place will be receiving \$284,900 support its COVID-19 operating costs and pressures.
