## **MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT UPDATES**

**Public Works Maintenance** - Please be advised the following Public Works activities will be occurring on Wednesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>:

- Road Closure - Albert Street (between Beckwith Street – Judson Street) – The street will be closed starting at 7:00 a.m. for repairs to the distribution system. Detours will be in place to assist residents.
- Single Lane Reduction – Waterside Drive – A portion of Waterside Drive will be reduced to one lane for repairs to the water distribution system. Residents will still be able to use Waterside Drive, however traffic control measures will be in place.

Only those residents impacted by the repairs will be advised of any potential interruptions to the supply of water.


## **PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT UPDATES**

### **COVID-19 Community Based Cases**

According to the Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit's most recent surveillance report (May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2020), there have been a total of 154 [community-based cases in this region](#). This number does include health care workers but not retirement and long-term care facility cases. Of the 154 cases, 48 are reported in Lanark East section which is comprised of Mississippi Mills, Carleton Place, Beckwith, Montague and Smiths Falls. Case counts for individual municipalities are not being released by the Health Unit.
