Household Hazardous Waste Depot & Compost Yard

Both the Household Hazardous Waste Facility & Compost Yard will remain closed until further notice. Public Works will continue to collect leaf bags curbside until the Compost Yard opens.

Waste Collection - Victoria Day – Monday, May 18, 2020

Due to the Victoria Day holiday garbage and recycling will not be collected on Monday, May 18th and will instead be collected on Tuesday, May 19th. FEDERAL GOVERNMENT UPDATES

The [application period](#) for the Canada Emergency Student Benefit (CESB) will begin on Friday, May 15, 2020. The CESB, which will be delivered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA), will provide temporary income support to eligible post-secondary students and new graduates who are unable to work or find work this summer due to COVID-19, or are working and are not making over \$1000.

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT UPDATES

Today, the Ontario government announced the retailers, seasonal businesses and health and community service providers who will be [permitted to open or expand their services on Tuesday, May 19, 2020](#) at 12:01 a.m., provided that the general trend on health indicators continues to improve as part of the first stage of the government's reopening framework.

The government also announced that additional seasonal services and activities will be permitted to open as early as Saturday, May 16, 2020 at 12:01 a.m., in time for the Victoria Day long weekend, as key public health indicators continue to show progress.
