## **PROVINCIAL UPDATES**

**[Ontario Extends COVID-19 Vaccination Booking to More Age Groups](#) - Province makes steady progress on vaccine rollout and leads Country with doses administered** - The Ontario government is extending booking for COVID-19 vaccination appointments to more age groups through its [provincial booking system](#) in 10 public health units on Friday, April 2nd, 2021.

As of 8:00 a.m. booking eligibility for COVID-19 vaccination appointments at mass immunization clinics will extend to more Ontarians in the following regions:

### **Individuals aged 60 and over:**

- Toronto Public Health; and
- Peel Public Health.

### **Individuals aged 70 and over:**

- North Bay Parry Sound District;
- Peterborough Public Health;
- Eastern Ontario Health Unit;
- Haliburton, Kawartha, Pine Ridge District Health Unit;
- Hastings Prince Edward Public Health;
- Thunder Bay District Health Unit;
- Northwestern Health Unit; and
- Public Health Sudbury and Districts.

### **The following 10 public health units are already booking individuals aged 70 and over:**

- City of Hamilton Public Health Services;
- Grey Bruce Health Unit;
- Kingston, Frontenac and Lennox & Addington Public Health;
- Lambton Public Health;
- Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit;
- Niagara Region Public Health;
- Ottawa Public Health;
- Simcoe-Muskoka District Health Unit;
- Timiskaming Health Unit; and
- York Region Public Health.

## **OTHER UPDATES**

**Guide on Booking Your Vaccine Online** – The Almonte General Hospital (AGH) and Carleton Place and District Memorial Hospital (CPDMH) have prepared an [information sheet](#) that offers step-by-step, visual assistance on how to book an appointment online for a COVID-19 Vaccine for those ages 70 years and older. The guide also includes instructions on how to get on the contingency list which is used when there are extra doses left over at the end of a clinic day.

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**Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit - Outbreak declared at Interim Long Term Care Unit in Kemptville District Hospital** - The Health Unit is working with the Long-term Care/Convalescent Care Unit at Kemptville District Hospital to manage a COVID-19 outbreak. One staff member has tested positive for COVID-19. A single laboratory confirmed case of COVID-19 in a resident or staff member is considered as a confirmed COVID-19 outbreak in the home.
