

MUNICIPAL UPDATES

Notice of Decision - In accordance with Sections 34 and 70.2 of the *Planning Act* for the Amendment of the Development Permit By-law - **TAKE NOTICE** that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Carleton Place passed By-law 32-2021 on the 23rd day of February, 2021 under Sections 34 and 70.2 of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O., 1990.

THE SUBJECT LANDS of By-law 32-2021 apply to all lands within the “Mississippi Residential District.”

THE PURPOSE AND EFFECT of the amendment is to amend the permitted and discretionary uses permitted in the “Mississippi Residential District” and to introduce Development Standard provisions respecting setbacks, coverage, height, dwelling unit areas and other such performance standards to each type of use.

TAKE NOTICE that any person or public body may appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal in respect of the By-law by filing with the Clerk of the Town of Carleton Place not later than the **17th day of March, 2021**. [Ontario Invests in Historic Campaign to Accelerate Training for Personal Support Workers - Up to 8,200 New PSWs Will Be Ready to Work in Long-Term Care by Fall 2021](#) - The Ontario government is investing over \$115 million to train up to 8,200 new personal support workers (PSWs) for high-demand jobs in Ontario's health and long-term care sectors. In collaboration with Colleges Ontario, all 24 publicly assisted colleges will offer this innovative, fully funded program starting in April 2021. This is part of the government's Long-Term Care Staffing Plan, one of the largest PSW recruitment and training drives in the province's history.

OTHER UPDATES

Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit - COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic Sites Begin - The Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit, along with many community partners, are pleased to start providing COVID-19 vaccine at on-going community clinics in Kemptville, Almonte, Brockville and Smiths Falls. All appointments are booked ahead of time and there are no walk-ins. **As directed by the Ministry of Health, health care workers, with direct contact with people who are at higher risk of having COVID-19, are the first group to be provided vaccine in the community clinics.**

For the next several months, these four (4) clinics will be providing vaccine on a rotational basis by appointment only to specific groups following the [COVID-19 Distribution and Administration Roll Out Plan](#) based on the provincial framework, and availability of vaccine. Identifying specific groups is necessary because the Health Unit is only given a limited amount of vaccine (for example, right now we usually receive 3,000 to 5,000 doses each week for the approximately 24,000 people in the current priority groups) from the province, and each person needs two (2) doses of vaccine. Once

there is a bigger supply of vaccine, there will be more flexibility and residents will also be able to go to vaccine clinics held at specific times and locations in their local communities.

The province has identified individuals aged 80 plus as a priority group to receive the vaccine because of the high risk of serious health problems if they become infected with the COVID-19 virus. Responding to this direction, in the first week of March, we will focus on providing vaccine to residents of the remaining retirement homes. Next will be community members who are aged 80 and over, hopefully by mid-March, depending on availability of vaccine. For individuals in this age group, we are asking that they continue to check for details about the vaccine clinics at www.healthunit.org, on our [Facebook](#) & [Twitter](#) accounts, from their health care provider, and through local radio and newspaper reports. When it is time to register for the vaccine clinics, the Health Unit will provide information on how to register for a clinic and will have a number to call if help is needed.
