Use of Public Benches Now Prohibited

The use of public benches is now prohibited. While these closures may seem daunting, we remind residents that they are for your safety. This closure may come as a surprise for residents who are not on Facebook and choose to sit on a bench that might be missing a sign. We ask that you practice patience and kindness if you see anyone using a bench. The Town of Carleton Place appreciates your assistance in respecting this safety precaution.

Discarding Used Masks and Gloves Safely

Some residents are wearing masks or gloves when shopping or going out in public. Used gloves and masks should be placed in the trash. Discarding used gloves or masks on the ground is a health risk and could result in a fine of \$100 in Carleton Place. The Health Unit updates the numbers of lab-confirmed positive Covid-19 cases in our tri-county area Monday through Friday at 2:30 p.m. on their <u>website</u>. Recently, they have started breaking it down even further. Carleton Place is in the Lanark East region. To align with the Ministry of Health's reporting system, the daily summary must be based on the data that is in the province's disease reporting system called iPHIS (integrated Public Health Information System) as of 4:00 p.m. the previous day. This ensures alignment of the data they report with the data the province reports.
