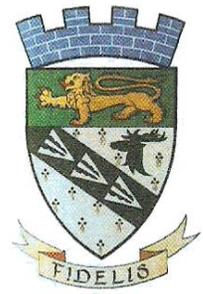

### **Garbage Stickers – New Retailer**

Effective immediately - the Town of Carleton Place Public Works Department would like to inform residents that **garbage stickers can be purchased at Shoppers Drug Mart**, located at 315 McNeely Avenue, during regular store hours.

***Stickers are no longer available at IDA Drug Mart.***

As part of COVID-19 safety precautions regarding minimizing contact, residents will be required to purchase a minimum of 10 stickers at a time. This requirement is for the protection and safety of frontline staff at Shoppers Drug Mart.

### **Brockville COVID-19 Assessment Centre Open to Walk-ins**

The Brockville COVID-19 Assessment Centre, located at 100 Magedoma Blvd, has established a new “self-present” model that will begin on Friday, April 17. This means that appointments or referrals for the Centre are no longer required and people can come to the building to be assessed for testing.

Individuals are encouraged to complete the [online COVID 19 assessment tool](#) before attending the Brockville Assessment Centre between 10:00 a.m. - 5:30 p.m., seven (7) days a week to be assessed for testing. If getting to the Centre is an issue, please call the Health Unit and discuss your transportation needs.

Other assessment centres within Leeds, Grenville & Lanark, (Almonte and Smiths Falls) will continue to use a referral system. Referrals can be sent by a primary care provider (family doctor, nurse practitioner, or clinic) or by the Health Unit, 1-800-660-5853 ext .2222.
