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The Town of Carleton Place continues to monitor new information regarding the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT UPDATES**

#### **Reminder: Spring Leaf Collection**

The curbside collection of leaves will continue next week, Monday, April 20<sup>th</sup> – Friday, April 24<sup>th</sup>. We are asking residents to place the leaf bags at the curb for collection in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Bags should be at the curb by 7:00 a.m.
- Public Works will only accept items in paper leaf bags. Items in plastic bags will not be collected.
- Bags should not exceed 15kg
- It is vital for residents to practice social distancing so please do not approach staff collecting yard waste bags.

### **FEDERAL GOVERNMENT UPDATES**

The Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, <u>announced new actions to protect Canadian jobs and provide more support to businesses and organizations</u> dealing with the economic impacts of COVID-19. The Government of Canada will provide over \$1.7 billion for targeted measures.

The Minister of Transport, the Honourable Marc Garneau, <u>announced new measures</u> requiring all air passengers to have a non-medical mask or face covering to cover their mouth and nose during travel. These measures come into effect at noon on April 20, 2020.



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#### PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT UPDATES

The Ontario government is investing \$20 million to <u>advance medical research and develop tools</u> <u>and resources to combat COVID-19</u> and other infectious diseases through the Ontario <u>COVID-19 Rapid Research Fund</u>.

The governments of Canada and Ontario are investing up to \$1 million in new funding to connect workers with in-demand jobs in the agri-food sector to keep the nation's supply chains strong and store shelves stocked during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Ontario government has partnered with Rogers Communications and Apple to help <u>meet the educational needs of students and families</u> during the COVID-19 outbreak
