POSITION SUMMARY:

Reporting directly to the Manager of Recreation and Culture, the Facilities Labourer will provide operational support to the Recreation & Culture Department by assisting with maintenance of municipal facilities, equipment and grounds. The responsibilities include general labour duties as required to clean, maintain and keep safe municipal recreation facilities and equipment.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Performs maintenance & operational duties to ensure the safe operation of arenas, community centres, municipal buildings, parks, trails, waterfronts, ball diamonds, playing fields, etc. Maintenance is performed based on daily, weekly, and monthly schedules.
2. Provide support to the Facility Supervisor on duty by performing maintenance to arenas including ice surface maintenance, assisting in flooding of ice arenas, cleaning and other maintenance duties.
3. Perform manual labour support for special events, hockey games and tournaments, and public skating events including set up and takedown of halls.
4. Completes custodial duties of municipal facilities as required.
5. Responsible to provide customer service to all users of the facilities and always maintain a positive and professional manner.
6. Operates & maintains janitorial equipment, Groundskeeping equipment and other town owned equipment.
7. Able to work evenings and weekends on a routine basis, and
8. Availability to be considered for this position is May to September.

The above generally describes the duties involved with the position. However, municipal work is varied in nature, employees will be required to perform duties in addition to the duties listed above from time to time as directed by the Manager of Recreation and Culture.

EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum age 16.

EXPERIENCE:

Would be an asset.

SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

1. Must possess & maintain a valid Ontario drivers' licence (minimum "G2").
2. Ability to perform maintenance, janitorial, parks and other facility operational duties.
3. Must be able to work independently as well as part of a team.
4. Ability to maintain a professional demeanor at all times when dealing with the public and volunteers.
5. Physically capable to perform general labour and maintenance duties as well as skating for public skating monitoring.
6. First Aid and CPR-AED certification an asset.
7. Vulnerable Sector Check.
8. Must be able to handle multiple tasks at one time, and
9. Availability to be considered for this position is May to September.

SAFETY:

The Town of Carleton Place believes that all accidents can be prevented. While performing the above duties, employees shall make safety an integral part of every task and job. Employees shall be familiar with the Town's Safety Policy and understand their:

- Right to Participate;
- Right to Know;
- Right to Refuse Unsafe Work; and
- Right to Stop Dangerous Work.

All employees must follow the Town's Health and Safety Policy and comply with the Occupational Health & Safety Act.

WORKING CONDITIONS:

Hours of Work - A flexible rotating schedule of 40 hours per week will be implemented including early mornings, days, evenings, overnight, weekends and statutory holidays. Ability to work in a fast-paced environment with changing priorities.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS – The Facilities Labourer will perform regular physical effort walking and may be required to walk on uneven and/or slippery surfaces. The position may be required to bend, lift and/or carry heavy objects, climb stairs and ladders. Occasional strenuous physical activity may result in muscle fatigue or strain. Must be able to lift up to 50 pounds, carry items such as mops, shovels, bags of garbage and boxes; must be able to mop, sweep and vacuum floors, reach and bend, stock shelves.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS - The Facilities Labourer may experience changing temperatures from building to ice surface. The position will be exposed to occasional unpleasant fumes, dirt, hazardous substances, and/or loud noises associated with cleaning duties, facility and ice maintenance, etc. Must be prepared and able to work

both indoors and out and in all seasons; weather conditions ranging from very cold to very hot and humid and able to work in an environment with exposure to cleaning materials (all required Personal Protective Equipment required is available and must be used). Occasional exposure to unpleasant sights and smells.

SENSORY DEMANDS – The position requires the individual to be able to walk on the ice surface while pushing nets. The position requires the use of cleaning equipment such as broom, mop, vacuum, and floor polisher.

MENTAL DEMANDS – The Facilities Labourer may occasionally have to manage a number of requests and tasks at one time and to deal with tight deadlines while accommodating unplanned interruptions. Excellent organization and time management skills will be needed to complete the required tasks. The Facilities Labourer must be prepared to deal with a variety of people and occasional stressful situations associated with working with the general public.

N.B. Must be able to read and comprehend instructions in regard to cleaning products, equipment operation and comprehending SOP's (standard operating procedures) in relation to deliveries of product and schedules.
