Dogs are only permitted to be off leash at community dog parks, or on private property.

- Roy Brown Dog Park- End of Lake Ave West

Please note that off-leash play in fenced ball diamonds and play grounds is not permitted.

Provincial COVID-19 Stay-at-home Order

Town Hall Closure – To comply with the Provincial Stay-at-home Order, the Town Hall will be closed to the public until at least February 11th. Even though the facility will be closed to the public, all departments are open for business. Please contact staff by phone or email. Payments Owing to the Town - For any payments owing to the Town, options include online or telephone banking, mailing a cheque to the Town Hall or dropping a payment off in the mail slot at the Police Station located at 15 Coleman Street. We encourage residents to use these means of payment if at all possible. Town

Hall does offer payment via credit card, however there is a 3% service charge on the value of the payment to recover costs. Please call 613-257-6200 to use this service.

With respect to parking tickets already issued, the timelines for payment and/or options to address the infraction can be found on the back of the ticket. These timelines are mandated by the Province.

With respect to amounts owing for taxes and water, we encourage payment by the means noted above if at all possible.

Recreation Facilities Remain Closed Due to Provincewide Shutdown - Due to the Provincially mandated COVID-19 shutdown, the following facilities remain closed:

- Carleton Place Arena;
- Carleton Place Pool;
- Carleton Place Canoe Club;
- The Station Active Living Centre.
